The California Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) program has funded projects large and small throughout the State totaling over **4.5 billion dollars**. Last year alone, the CWSRF program **awarded over 477 million dollars in new contracts**.

Have you had trouble funding your water quality and wastewater projects? Are you looking for low-cost options to fund future projects? Do your rate-payers think that they are paying too much? The CWSRF program can help with funding projects.

We provide low-interest loans for:

- Construction of publicly owned treatment works, such as wastewater and water recycling facilities and municipal landfill treatment systems;
- Implementation of non-point source projects and programs;
- Development and implementation of estuary comprehensive conservation and management plans; and
- Storm water treatment projects.

In order to manage the CWSRF program successfully, the Division of Financial Assistance (DFA) is seeking comments from interested parties or stakeholders regarding the program's short and long-term goals and how we can measure success in achieving those goals. Public comments are essential in developing the program's Fiscal Year 2009-10 Intended Use Plan and CWSRF Project Priority List, which will greatly impact how the program funds are spent.
